

Ann Haysir of Shandy Hall died in May of 1935.  
My family moved into Shandy Hall <sup>right afterwards</sup> because they  
did not want to leave house empty with all the  
antique's. I was 12 yrs old and had two brothers,  
14 & 4. Mother & Dad lived there until 1960 when father  
got sick. There was a Mrs. DeVan lived there with Ann,  
and also a lot of cats. The cats were killed, they did not  
think they would be taken care of.

We moved into Seven rooms on East side of house -  
a large kitchen - pantry - linen closet - front room and  
three bedroom's. Kitchen & one bed room was black as  
coal, my brother & ~~sister~~ I picked the two other ones.  
There was a kerosine cook stove and also Mrs. DeVan had  
a kerosine heater in bedroom.

The well was down at <sup>the</sup> bottom of hill in the back. We  
used it until mice got in it. Water had to be carried  
up hill. Toilet was outside and no electric. We did  
our home work with kerosine lamps. Had a coal-wood  
stove in North East corner of kitchen & one in the front  
room. Also in N.E. corner behind stove was a small sink  
hooked up to rain water, used for dishes & cleaning and  
etc. The people, whose house was left too, Mr. Lawrence  
& Rabut <sup>now</sup> Mrs. White started to work on house. They had  
to do some plastering, painting & used linen closet from a  
bath room. Put a drilled well in big side porch.  
Also a furnace and the electric.

There was a big barn on other side of road,  
and a large tree down by the well - it was  
250 years old Elm.
